Rotating Shelter for Homeless Men

The Cupertino/Sunnyvale/Saratoga Rotating Shelter program will be here at St. Joseph of Cupertino again, from **Friday, June 27-Saturday, August 2**. This is the 17th year that our parish will be participating in this program. Churches (and one Synagogue) in the area take turns providing shelter and meals for up to fifteen men, while the men search for employment and permanent housing under the guidance of a case manager. Our AV room will be the housing site.

LIFELINE SCREENING

Stroke is the #1 cause of nursing home admissions and the third leading killer in the United States today.

Life Line Screening would like to help you prevent this life-threatening disease from hurting your quality of life. On **Friday June 20**, St Joseph's of Cupertino Catholic Church will be hosting a day of preventative health screenings for the Cupertino community. The **4 tests offered** include an ultrasound screening of the carotid arteries in the neck (most strokes are linked to plaque build-up in these arteries) another ultrasound screening of the Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm (ruptured AAA's have an 85-94% mortality rate and usually present little or no symptoms), a third test which screens for plaque build-up in the arteries of the legs Peripheral Arterial Disease plaque build-up (a strong indicator of coronary artery disease) and a fourth test that screens for signs of osteoporosis.

These non-invasive, completely painless vascular screenings take about 10 minutes each, you can get all four for just \$139.00! Save \$41. **YOU MUST PRE-REGISTER.** Appointments spaces are limited, so please sign up now by calling toll free to 1-800-324-1851. You will be sent a reminder post card and be given a courtesy reminder phone call one day prior to the screening, so please sign up in advance! Every 45 seconds, someone will have a stroke, Every 3 minutes someone will die from one! **Life Line Screening can help.**

NEW SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM AVAILABLE FOR SAN JOSE DIOCESAN CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

The BASIC Fund (Bay Area Scholarships for Innercity Children) is expanding its services. It now serves lower/middle income families in several areas. Recently these scholarship funds became available to Santa Clara County families who send their children to Catholic schools. You may qualify if your household size and annual income meet the following guidelines:

Household Size	Income Range
2	\$18,065 - 38,103
3	\$21,110 - 47,896
4	\$24,155 - 57,600
5	\$27,200 - 67,304
6	\$30,245 - 77,008

Based on your Household Size and Income, The BASIC Fund may provide tuition assistance ranging from 25% to 75% of your tuition, up to a maximum of \$1,600 per child.

This is a great opportunity for those of you who want to send your child to St. Joseph of Cupertino School, but cannot afford the full tuition. We have a school financial aid program, and now The BASIC Fund is offering additional and significant financial support. We still have a few openings in our 2008-2009 Kindergarten class, as well as openings in some of the other grades.

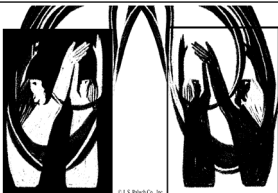
