Each night will be celebrated by a priest from another diocesan church. The choir, from different ministries at St. Joseph, will sing in English and Tagalog (the Filipino language). On one evening, the choir will be composed of seminarians. The servers, participants, reception sponsors – all will gladly offer their shared, heartfelt participation in this wonderful tradition. ANSWER TO LAST WEEK'S QUESITON: WHAT IS THE LITURGICAL YEAR? The church runs on a yearly calendar, sanctifying the times and seasons. This is one of the ways Christians have to mark the sacred or holy events. The most important feast of the church year is Easter, which is preceded by the TRIDUUM (three days, which begins on Holy Thursday and ends with Easter. We are now in the season of Advent which begins the liturgical year. The ordinary color used is purple except on the third week when pink is used to because we are getting closer to Christmas and therefore joyful.
