The furnace on the top floor of the rectory—the place where Fr. Chady and Fr. Peter reside—is broken, preventing the proper functioning of the air conditioning. In fact, Fr. Chady and Fr. Peter have not had air conditioning in their rooms for a few weeks because of this problem. The parish office has been informed that the 31-year-old furnace is beyond repair and must be replaced; the cost will be more than \$2,000. If you are in a position to help pay for this project, the priests would surely be grateful for whatever you could do to make their quarters more comfortable. 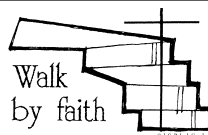

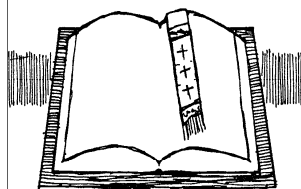
