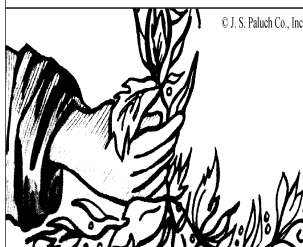
Young Adult Ministry
