

A LETTER FROM FR. CHADY

Dear SJC Parishioners,

Looking back after four years of being parochial vicar, it seems just yesterday when I was assigned at St. Joseph's as a newly ordained priest. As my first parish assignment St. Joseph Parish has been a great blessing to me. As you are aware of my move to another parish, I want to take this opportunity to thank all of you for allowing me to be part of your community and sharing with me a meaningful and inspiring life for the first four years of my priestly ministry. I thank you for your great support, your love, and care. I thank those who supported me in the different ministries: our altar servers ministry, infant baptism ministry, youth and young adult ministry, Filipino American ministry, and social justice ministry. In a special way, I want to thank Fr. Greg, who from the day I began my ministry has been very supportive and a good mentor to me. I thank him for guiding me and for sharing with me his wisdom in serving our people. I also thank all staff members who have been kind to make me feel I belonged to the family, and for their trust and confidence in my service.

The blessings, joy, and meaningful experiences I have found in my ministry with you have made it difficult for me to accept my re-assignment. However, I have known from the day of my ordination that this is the kind of life to which we priests are called to live. We move from parish to parish in order for us to bring God's presence and share the gift of our priestly ministry with others.

Today I'm writing this letter after we had our vigil with the pope in the Vatican on the occasion of the culmination of the YEAR OF THE PRIEST. At this celebration I offered my prayers for all of you and I thanked God for giving me such a wonderful community! Please remember me in your prayers and may God bless you all.

Rotating Shelter Here July 2nd to August 7th

Our parish will host the Faith in Action Rotating Shelter for Homeless Men during the month of July. This is the 18th year that our parish will be participating in this program. A number of local churches, synagogues, and community groups work with West Valley Community Services to provide food, shelter, support, case management, referral services, and transitional housing for homeless men who are willing and able to find gainful employment and a place to live. The shelter rotates to a different church/congregation each month.

We need your help to provide meals, or to act as shoppers or greeters. We will need **diners** for 16 men delivered warm and ready to eat each evening at 8:00 p.m. to our AV room (at the end of the school building). Also, we would like to provide light **breakfasts** on weekends (bread/rolls and fruit). **Shoppers** will be needed to stop in at 8 p.m. to check on breakfast and lunch materials and to buy what is needed. Shoppers may donate their purchases or be reimbursed from our Outreach fund. **Greeters**, acting as our friendly parish representatives, are needed to come to the shelter at 7:45 and stay for about an hour to welcome and socialize with the guests as they return from work or job-hunting. FEATURED MINISTRY OF THE WEEK! MOMMY AND ME PLAYGROUP:


Description: We are a group of moms and kids ages 0-4 who meet weekly for prayer, songs, circle time and crafts.
