Shoppers may donate their purchases or be reimbursed from our Outreach fund. **Greeters**, acting as our friendly parish representatives, are needed to come to the shelter at 7:45 and stay for about an hour to welcome and socialize with the guests as they return from work or job-hunting. 


**MOMMY AND ME PLAYGROUP:**
