

Fr. Greg & our parish received this letter from West Valley Community Services, dated August 20, 2010

It is with a heavy heart that we inform you of the closure of the Faith In Action/West Valley Community Services Rotating Shelter Program. After having sheltered 15 men a night for the past 18 years, the costs to operate the program far exceeded the revenues to keep the program open. We want to thank you for your many years of service, partnership and support in the operations of the program.

The economic downturn has had devastating impacts on many of our community members. WVCS like many other non-profits, continues to brace for several more years of increased demand for services with ever decreasing resources. Funding cuts to WVCS has forced the elimination of several of our essential programs and services.

WVCS has worked to find alternative funding resources to keep these programs in operation as they serve the most vulnerable of our community. Unfortunately some of these resources did not come to fruition which means the elimination of our Rotating Shelter program and significant reduction of our Food Pantry and Emergency Assistance program which provides food, emergency cash assistance and case management services.

We have not given up and continue to do all that we can to secure new sources of funding to keep these vital programs operating to serve the most vulnerable in our community.

ANNUAL EDUCATION APPEAL

The Annual Education Appeal, which will be held on the weekend of September 11-12, 2010 in our Diocese, is most important as it provides financial assistance to many of our Catholic students who want to receive a Catholic education. This special collection is for the scholarship fund that supports the tuition aid program for elementary and high school students in our schools. Although not all parishes have schools, they all have families with school age children. Our schools provide that choice. Over 16,000 students are educated in our 30 elementary school and 6 high schools and many are there because of the generosity and support of your parish community.

Thanksgiving Food Baskets

St. Joseph of Cupertino parish has been providing Thanksgiving food baskets for local needy families for over 35 years. This effort is co-sponsored annually by our own St. Joseph's Outreach and parish community, our own St. Joseph's school, and West Valley Community Services (located just a block away from us at 10104 Vista Drive).

Each year in November, St. Joseph's volunteers put together two big boxes of food and supplies for each needy family or individual. Approximately 200 families are assisted each year.

St. Joseph's Outreach donations fund this effort, with a budget of \$4 to 5,000. Outreach donations are collected after all the Masses on the fifth Sundays of the month, which occur about four times a year. If you missed the Outreach collection on August 28/29, it's not too late to put your donation into an envelope marked "Outreach". The next Outreach collection will occur on Saturday/Sunday, October 30/31.

Many thanks to several parishioners who have already volunteered to head up this effort. The leadership jobs are described below:

1. Facilitator for Logistics Support: arranges for supply and food pickup in November.
2. Coordinator on Assembly Day: on Sunday, November 21, coordinates the volunteers during the basket assembly process in our parish hall, 8 a.m. to 1 p.m.
3. Coordinator on Distribution Day: on Monday, November 22, coordinates the St. Joseph's volunteers who deliver the baskets to the recipients with the assistance of the West Valley Community Services staff, 8 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

We will be putting this program into high gear about a month before Thanksgiving, so please watch for coming notices in the bulletin.

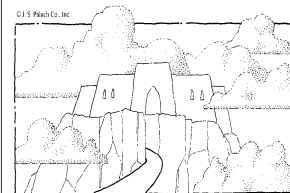

San Lorenzo Ruiz (1600-1637) was martyred during severe persecution of Japanese Christians under the Tokugawa Shogunate in the 17th century. He was beatified in Manila on February 18, 1981 by Pope John Paul II during his Papal visit to Manila, the first beatification ceremony held outside the Vatican. San Lorenzo Ruiz was elevated to sainthood and canonized by Pope John Paul II in the Vatican City, Rome on October 18, 1987.
