PERSISTENCE

As the end of the liturgical calendar draws near the liturgy focuses more and more on the end of time. This week we are reminded that God's ultimate victory may be a long way off. Perseverance in prayer, proclamation, and work will be needed along the way. The characters in today's readings can serve as role models for us on the long journey of discipleship.

In the reading from Exodus Joshua does not give up fighting, Moses does not give up praying, and Aaron and Hur do not give up supporting him until the victory is won. In the Gospel story the widow does not stop begging until justice is done. As the letter to Timothy urges, we are to "be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient" until the coming of "Christ Jesus, who will judge the living and the dead" (2 Timothy 4:2, 1).
