Our Blessed Mother, who appeared at **Fatima**, Portugal in 1917 to three little children, Lucia, Francisco, and Jacinta, specifically requested that the faithful observe the **"First Saturdays"**.

Our Lady's words to Lucia: "Jesus wants to establish devotion to my Immaculate Heart in the world." Our Lady also asks that reparation for sin be made in this way.

On the first Saturdays of the month, she has asked that one go to Mass and receive Holy Communion, recite 5 decades of the rosary, and spend 15 additional minutes meditating on one or more of the mysteries of the rosary, with the intention of making reparation for the sins of the world dishonoring Our Blessed Mother. Also, one must go to confession within a week before or after the First Saturday.

As a very special addition in our parish for the First Saturdays, **Brother John Samaha S.M.** will speak from **9:30 – 10:00 a.m.** (immediately following Mass and rosary) about Our Blessed Mother, her attributes, and her feast days of the month.

November honors *Our Lady of Miraculous Medal* and *The Presentation of Mary*.

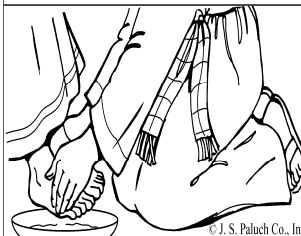
