1913: Archbishop Patrick W. Riordan elevates mission to parish status on November 4. Control of the church transfers from the Jesuits to Archdiocese of San Francisco. Rev. Thomas O'connell appointed as pastor and first resident priest.

BEREAVEMENT---provides salads and desserts for funerals. People rotate so it does not happen very often.

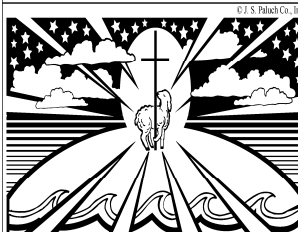
FUNERAL RECEPTIONS (-when a funeral reception takes place here at the parish)----helps families set up, serves food, and packages leftovers for families to take home.
