“In our diocesan family tree, St. Joseph of Cupertino is a true **mother church**. It has begotten seven new parishes.” (Bishop Pierre DuMaine). Parishes spun off from St. Joseph:

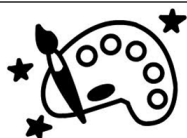
- January 17, 1951 Sacred Heart, Saratoga
- October 25, 1951 St. Justin, Santa Clara
- June 25, 1955 St. Simon, Los Altos
- June 27, 1959 St. Lawrence the Martyr, Santa Clara
- June 25, 1960 Queen of Apostles, San Jose
- November 4, 1963 Church of the Resurrection, Sunnyvale
- June 27, 1964 Church of Ascension, Saratoga



Building the church of God in Cupertino continued.

- 1959 – Parish Hall enlarged
- 1961 – New rectory built at cost of \$119,530
- 1963 – Property was purchased to build a convent
- 1966 – Convent for 16 sisters completed

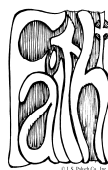
