Pastor (1967 – 1972): Msgr. Chester Thompson.

Pastor (1972 – 1985): Rev. John Tierney. “Fr. Tierney was so jolly and cheerful. He was always at the back door of the chapel after Sunday Mass with a cheery word. It didn’t matter what the weather was...he was there to greet everyone. He generally had some little story or joke to lift up our spirits and make us feel good.” (Mary Cali)

Pastor (1985 -1995): Monsignor Joseph J. Milani. “It must be for us living now, an encouragement to continue to build up the faith and wellbeing of each other. We must move with the same zeal and enthusiasm as those who planted and went before us.” (Ed. Note: quoted from the 1988 Anniversary book. Relevant words for today, too.)

#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

We owe today’s beautiful feast to a valiant woman who suffered a great deal to establish a feast out of her love for the Eucharist. Juliana was a nun in Belgium in the thirteenth century. She served in a hospital for lepers. She became convinced through her prayer that the liturgical year was incomplete because it had no feast for the Eucharist. Her efforts were not welcome, and a supervising priest sought to punish her for promoting a feast that “nobody wanted.” He even had her accused of financial mismanagement and banished her from her convent. Shortly after she was exiled, the bishop approved the feast. It quickly spread through Europe. In those days, people very seldom received Holy Communion, and so the processions through the streets with the eucharistic bread not only led to an awareness of Christ’s hunger to be with us, but prepared the way for a deeper desire to receive Christ’s Body and Blood in more frequent Communion. The feast grew rapidly, but Juliana disappeared into poverty and a hidden life. She ended her days as an “ anchoress,” a woman living in seclusion in a room attached to a parish church. Imagine her delight at seeing us gathered at the table of the Lord on this day, aware of Christ’s presence in our midst, sharing fully in Christ’s Body and Blood. Our celebration today invests her struggle and sorrows with dignity and meaning.

### Rotating Shelter News

*This is the 21<sup>st</sup> year that St. Joseph of Cupertino has participated in the Faith in Action Silicon Valley Rotating Shelter program for homeless men in our area. We will be hosting the shelter once again for the month of July in our parish, providing shelter, food, and assistance to 15 men who are willing and able to work and to regain their independence.*

*Faith in Action provides professional case management, overnight supervisors, and other supportive services for our clients. The applicants are carefully screened, are drug and alcohol free, and are allowed to stay for a period of up to 90 days, as long as they are in compliance with program requirements and are making progress towards the goal of self-sufficiency and permanent housing.*


*From June 28 till August 3, the shelter will be located in our parish hall/school, and we will be asking for your assistance to provide dinners, do shopping for breakfast and lunch materials, and to act as greeter/host. During the month of June, you will see parish volunteers sitting at sign-up tables outside all Masses, and we hope you will consider helping the shelter program in some capacity.*
