A wonderful, wonderful memory from **DICK SHERMAN**, a stalwart at St. Joseph of Cupertino! He responded to the memory lane reminiscing about our parish school. His memory piece is from 1984.

“Sr. Attracta was a very special lady. Although she didn't have any classroom duties in the school, she worked in the office and was always on the lookout for a student who may have fallen on the asphalt playground or similarly found themselves in need of first aid. Sr. Attracta had a freezer full of frozen sponges that she quickly applied to the injured appendage along with soothing words and a big hug. She always wore a full habit and was the quintessential nun. Whenever a student required a hospital stay (tonsils, etc) the first person they saw upon recovery was often Sr. Attracta. When Kelly had her tonsils removed, Sr. Attracta was right there shoos the nurses out of the room and taking charge herself. I have very fond memories of this extraordinary woman.”

### Rotating Shelter News

*This is the 21<sup>st</sup> year that St. Joseph of Cupertino has participated in the Faith in Action Silicon Valley Rotating Shelter program for homeless men in our area. We will be hosting the shelter once again for the month of July in our parish, providing shelter, food, and assistance to 15 men who are willing and able to work and to regain their independence.*

*Faith in Action provides professional case management, overnight supervisors, and other supportive services for our clients. The applicants are carefully screened, are drug and alcohol free, and are allowed to stay for a period of up to 90 days, as long as they are in compliance with program requirements and are making progress towards the goal of self-sufficiency and permanent housing.*

*From June 28 till August 3, the shelter will be located in our parish hall/school, and we will be asking for your assistance to provide dinners, do shopping for breakfast and lunch materials, and to act as greeter/host. During the month of June, you will see parish volunteers sitting at sign-up tables outside all Masses, and we hope you will consider helping the shelter program in some capacity.*

#### Rexband USA Tour, July 5th 2013, Flint Center, Cupertino

**CA** Jesus Youth is excited to present the Rexband USA Tour, coming to the Bay Area live on July 5th at the Flint Center, Cupertino. Jesus Youth is a missionary movement at the service of the Catholic Church, and has used its music talent for evangelization, through contemporary music that appeals to people of all ages especially the youth all around the world. This band calls themselves 'Rexband', in honor of 'Christus Rex' i.e. 'Christ the King'. The signature sound of the band is a fusion of contemporary pop and Indian classical music. One of very few world-class fully Catholic bands that are completely at the service of the Church, they have performed in front of millions of people, most notably, at the past four World Youth Days in Toronto, Cologne, Sydney, and Madrid. Some samples of their performances can be seen on the Rexband YouTube channel. They have a facebook page which can be easily reached by searching for Rexband in the facebook search box.

Rexband is coming on a tour of the USA this summer, on their way to Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, for the upcoming Word Youth Day. They are a team of 12 performers, including 6 vocalists, and a 7 piece orchestra and have released over 10 albums in different languages over the last decade. Their tour will be focused on the New Evangelization and the Year of Faith. Their first stop on this tour is going to be at the Flint Center, Cupertino. Through donations by Jesus Youth members, the tickets are subsidized and affordably priced at only \$20.
