He never forgot a name -- he would meet you years after and call you by your first name without hesitation. He also raised vegetables in back of the rectory, tomatoes, corn, green beans and the like. I would sometimes water them when he was going to be away. He had a green thumb! May he rest in peace."

### SOCIAL JUSTICE MINISTRY MISSION STATEMENT

The center of the Church's social teaching is the life, dignity and rights of every human person. Recognizing that the pursuit of social justice is an essential part of what makes a parish Catholic, we commit ourselves to concrete works of charity, justice and peacemaking.

### PARISH SOCIAL JUSTICE MINISTRY

Every day human interdependence grows more tightly drawn and spreads by degrees over the whole world. As a result the common good, that is, the sum of those conditions of social life which allow social groups and their individual members relatively through and ready access to their own fulfillment, today takes on an increasingly universal complexion and consequently involves rights and duties with respect to the whole human race. Every social group must take account of the needs and legitimate aspirations of other groups, and even of the general welfare of the entire human family. At the same time, however, there is a growing awareness of the exalted dignity proper to the human person, since he/(she) stands above all things, and his/her rights and duties are universal and inviolable. Therefore, there must be made available to all men (and women) everything necessary for leading a life truly human, such as food clothing, and shelter; the right to choose a state of life freely and to found a family, the right to education, to employment, to a good reputation, to respect, to appropriate information, to activity in accord with the upright norm of one's own conscience, to protection of privacy and rightful freedom even in matters religious. ### Rexband USA Tour, July 5th 2013, Flint Center, Cupertino

**CA** Jesus Youth is excited to present the Rexband USA Tour, coming to the Bay Area live on July 5th at the Flint Center, Cupertino. Jesus Youth is a missionary movement at the service of the Catholic Church, and has used its music talent for evangelization, through contemporary music that appeals to people of all ages especially the youth all around the world. This band calls themselves 'Rexband', in honor of 'Christus Rex' i.e. 'Christ the King'. The signature sound of the band is a fusion of contemporary pop and Indian classical music. One of very few world-class fully Catholic bands that are completely at the service of the Church, they have performed in front of millions of people, most notably, at the past four World Youth Days in Toronto, Cologne, Sydney, and Madrid. Some samples of their performances can be seen on the Rexband YouTube channel. They have a facebook page which can be easily reached by searching for Rexband in the facebook search box.

Rexband is coming on a tour of the USA this summer, on their way to Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, for the upcoming World Youth Day. They are a team of 12 performers, including 6 vocalists, and a 7 piece orchestra and have released over 10 albums in different languages over the last decade. Their tour will be focused on the New Evangelization and the Year of Faith. Their first stop on this tour is going to be at the Flint Center, Cupertino. Through donations by Jesus Youth members, the tickets are subsidized and affordably priced at only \$20. Members of this parish are encouraged to attend this concert as it is, by God's grace, expected to be an awe inspiring Holy Spirit filled event.
