CENTENNIAL MEMORY LANE

(Editorial Note: This is Part 7 of Justin Read's awesome journey at St. Joseph of Cupertino. Walk with him on his memory lane; enjoy his refreshing and inspiring reminiscing.)

Hi, I'm Justin Read. You may have seen me around the parish either singing in the 9:30 choir or playing piano occasionally at either the 9:30 or 5 pm Masses. I'm 16 years old and I'm currently attending Archbishop Mitty High School as an 11th grader this coming fall.

Music & The Arrival of Eric Chang: My interest in music at SJC most likely began somewhere during the First Friday Masses I attended at school, as well as my weekly attendance beginning in 2nd grade. Music was something that really intrigued me during the Mass and kept me desiring to come back again and again. As a child in the lower grades of SJC school, I looked up to **Mrs. Rose Smith** (then school music director) so much. I loved her voice, especially the fact that she always seemed to be smiling as she sang, and I could "hear" the smiling and happiness in her voice. Her enthusiastic and joyful musical direction at SJC school encouraged me to participate in the singing from the pews, both at school Masses and at parish Masses. I was also a piano player from a very young age, so **Mrs. Mary Ellen Hennig** was also someone I looked up to immensely. She played with such grace and poise and yet at the same time with elegant beauty on the keys.



I still remember the day when I first pondered the idea of playing myself at Mass one day. It was the closing Mass of the school year, 2005. The last song was "Alleluia! Raise the Gospel" and boy did I like that song or what! The lyrics had this urgent sense to it that really moved me deeply, and it just seemed so... happy! The song was so full of joy. While singing, I could picture in my heart the world spinning with a big enormous Bible above the earth, amidst cheers for Christ from all of God's children below.

Perhaps one of the biggest events to inspire my musicality was the arrival of **Eric Chang** on June 12, 2005 (I still remember the date!). As Eric played more and more at the 9:30 Mass, I grew to have a liking for his music. One of my favorite memories of Eric's playing was when the Mass was concluded with the song "Be Like the Sun". I loved the lyrics "Be like the sun, and shine on everyone..." It made me smile so much. Maybe I could be like the sun, too! This song beautifully prompted me, along with my mom's encouragement and with the grace of the Holy Spirit, to desire to play at Masses in the future.

In the 4th grade, the 2006-2007 school year, I began my music ministry involvement both in the parish and at the school. Thanks to the immense generosity and inclusive spirit of **Mrs. Hennig**, I got offered to play the whole Mass and the concluding song was "Be Like the Sun!" It was so wonderful, and I even tried for the first time to improvise a little. Honestly, a miracle graced my life that day. I had not once been taught how to improvise; my jazz studies did not begin until the fall of 2007. Yet, somehow I had just done it. I had attempted to emulate Eric as he was such an inspiration to me, yet here was this unique style of my own that was developing within my soul. An exact genre couldn't be put to it; I like to call it "Holy Spirit music" because I feel the Holy Spirit with me when I play. I just release everything to the piano - my deepest emotions, longings of my soul, frustrations, excitements, thankfulness, concerns, and lastly, willingness - and simply the Holy Spirit directs my hands where to go. I hardly think when I play; I simply let go and let the Spirit allow the piano to "breathe" God's love to His Church.

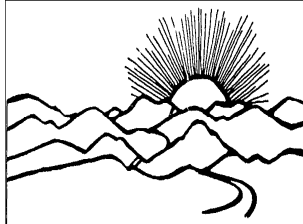

FROM THE SOCIAL JUSTICE MINISTRY

The center of the Church's social teaching is the life, dignity and rights of every human person. Recognizing that the pursuit of social ministry is an essential part of what makes a parish Catholic, we commit ourselves to concrete works of charity, justice and peacemaking.

Bishop Richard Garcia, chairman of the Restorative Justice Committee of the California Conference of Catholic Bishops and Bishop of the Diocese of Monterey issued the following statement today concerning state policies on prisoner isolation and the escalating nature of a hunger strike that has grown to include nearly 10 percent of California's prison population: "As Chair of the California Catholic Conference of Bishops Restorative Justice Committee, we call upon Gov. Brown and Dr. Jeffrey Beard, California Secretary of Correction and Rehabilitation (CDCR), to address the egregious overuse of solitary confinement, violations of CDCR treatment policies of prisoners in the Secure Housing Units (SHU) and threats against prisoners participating in this current non-violent demonstration on the inhumane treatment of human beings. **27 million human beings are trafficked yearly. It is important that we post the Trafficking Hotline as widely as we can. 1-888-3737-888**
