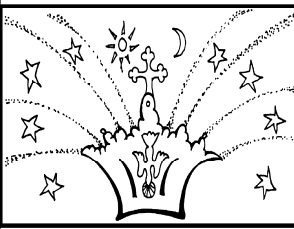
FROM THE SOCIAL JUSTICE MINISTRY

The center of the Church's social teaching is the life, dignity and rights of every human person. Recognizing that the pursuit of social ministry is an essential part of what makes a parish Catholic, we commit ourselves to concrete works of charity, justice and peacemaking.

Today's world is devastated by wars, poverty, and injustices, and for this very reason is in need of the good news of the Gospel. The Church believes in the dignity of every man and woman and their desire to live lives of authentic meaning. As globalization continues to spread around the globe, societies struggle to achieve justice and protect the unity of the family. The Church is also concerned about the growing gap between the rich and the poor.

The Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church provides an overview of the Church's social teachings on a variety of issues including salvation, the role of the family, the principle of common good, the rights of workers, morality and the economy, hope for peace, and a Christian's role in civic society.
