

Rotating Shelter News

This is the 22nd year that St. Joseph of Cupertino has participated in the Faith in Action Silicon Valley Rotating Shelter program for homeless men in our area. We will be hosting the shelter once again for the month of July (June 25 to July 26) in our parish, providing shelter, food, and assistance to 15 men who are willing and able to work and to regain their independence.

Faith in Action provides professional case management, overnight supervisors, and other supportive services for our clients. The applicants are carefully screened, are drug and alcohol free, and are allowed to stay for a period of up to 90 days, as long as they are in compliance with program requirements and are making progress towards the goal of self-sufficiency and permanent housing. Each month, the shelter “rotates” to a different church or synagogue.

The shelter will be located in our parish hall/school, and we will be asking for your assistance to provide dinners, do shopping for breakfast and lunch materials, and to act as greeter/host. We will need DINNERS for 16 men delivered to the outdoor courtyard next to the parish hall, warm and ready to eat each evening at 8:00 p.m. SHOPPERS will be on-call volunteers who will be notified of any staple foodstuffs needed, such as milk, lunch meat, fruit, etc. A LAUNDRY volunteer will be needed to take large bedding items to a local laundromat. We will need volunteers to assemble HYGIENE KITS and LAUNDRY KITS. There is always need of “QUARTERS FOR LAUNDRY”. Since this is an independent non-profit, your MONETARY DONATIONS are greatly needed and appreciated.

During the month of June, you will see parish volunteers sitting at sign-up tables outside all Masses, and we hope you will consider helping the shelter program in some capacity.

- Wednesday, August 27 for **Grade K**

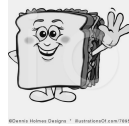
(Preschool: 7:30 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. beginning Aug. 25)

QUESTION FROM LAST WEEK: What is Pentecost?

When is it celebrated? *ANSWER: Pentecost occurs fifty days after Easter and closes the Easter season. It celebrates the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the first community of those who believed in Jesus. Pentecost is called the birthday of the church or the birth of the church's mission. The color for Pentecost is red symbolizing the intense love and fire of the Holy Spirit. Other symbols include the “dove”, “tongues of fire,” and the “wind.” (Catholic Customs & Traditions---Greg Dues)*
