

Rotating Shelter News

This is the 22nd year that St. Joseph of Cupertino has participated in the Faith in Action Silicon Valley Rotating Shelter program for homeless men in our area. We will be hosting the shelter once again for the month of July (June 25 to July 26) in our parish, providing shelter, food, and assistance to 15 men who are willing and able to work and to regain their independence.

Faith in Action provides professional case management, overnight supervisors, and other supportive services for our clients. The applicants are carefully screened, are drug and alcohol free, and are allowed to stay for a period of up to 90 days, as long as they are in compliance with program requirements and are making progress towards the goal of self-sufficiency and permanent housing. Each month, the shelter “rotates” to a different church or synagogue.

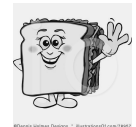
The shelter will be located in our parish hall/school, and we will be asking for your assistance to provide dinners, do shopping for breakfast and lunch materials, and purchase items for hygiene and laundry kits. Quarters for laundry and monetary donations for this very worthy non-profit are greatly needed. We hope you will consider helping the shelter program in some capacity.

Paula and her husband Paul were the founders of the De Cillis Vietnam Conflict Collection at the De Anza College Library. She has also been an active member of Quota International, a community service organization that has funded everything from books and games for local school students to emergency shelter for women who are victims of domestic violence. Paula is the latest in a long line of SJC parishioners who have been honored by the city in this way. CREST stands for Cupertino Recognizes Extra Steps Taken.

As the senior population increases so does the need for resources. One resource focusing on keeping loved ones in their home is non medical home care services. Recognizing the growing need and the fragility of older adults, Catholic Charities has developed the Day Break Home Care program. The program allows seniors and disabled adults to remain in their own homes with trained and certified caregivers. Day Break Home Care assists with personal care, transportation, meal prep, appointments, and light housekeeping. We encourage our caregivers to establish a strong bond and relationship; consistency is key to a successful home care experience. It is important to have trustworthy helping hands while remaining safe and independent in the comfort of their own homes. We understand the variables and challenges that often occur with an aging adult and we understand the uniqueness of each person. Our goal is to provide exceptional services and the reassurance of people you trust that are caring for people you love.

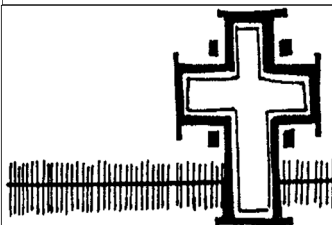
Dinner for College Students/Young Professionals
