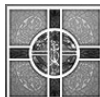
God rich in kindness and generous in love,

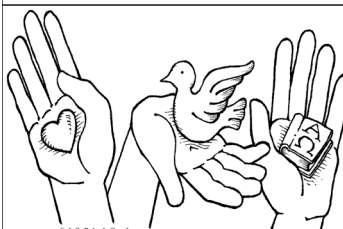
