Rotating Shelter Update

Already, over 100 individuals and families have signed up to volunteer for the shelter, and/or have made donations. Many, many thanks!!! We greatly appreciate the generosity and support of Father Greg, our parish and school, and everyone who is helping!

Faith in Action Silicon Valley Rotating Shelter will be located here at St. Joseph's from June 27 till August 1. All of our dinners and breakfasts are covered, and almost all of our shopping dates are filled in. Would you be able to be an "on call" shopper (*you are called only if needed*), buying minor grocery items, such as milk and lunch meat, etc.? Our open dates for shoppers are July 4, 5, 11, 12, 18, 19, 26.

Other ways you may help: donate individual bags of trail mix, energy bars, ziplock baggies (sandwich & gallon size), plastic wrap, aluminum foil; regular/large size bar soap, shampoo, toothpaste, shaving cream, disposable razors, deodorant, toothbrushes; new or clean socks, underwear, pillows, towels, large backpacks, sleeping bags; bicycles in running condition, helmets, locks.

You may also make individual "laundry kits". Quarters for laundry are always appreciated. Faith in Action is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, and we depend upon donations and grants to provide for operating expenses such as our professional case manager and overnight supervisors. All donations to the shelter made during the month of June will be matched up to \$25,000.
