Altar Server Training Signups

If you have completed the 4th grade and have received your First Holy Communion you can, with your parents permission, sign up to be trained as an Altar Server. Training consists of five, one-hour sessions, held once per week.

QUESTION FROM LAST WEEK: What is a "deacon?" *The word "deacon" is from a Greek word for "servant." A deacon is a man who has received the first level of Holy Orders (the diaconate) and is committed to helping bishops and priests in serving the Church. There are two types of deacons: a "transitional" deacon who is preparing for priesthood and a "permanent" deacon who will remain a permanent deacon. A permanent deacon must be at least thirty five years old and may be married. These deacons baptize, assist at liturgies, read the Gospel and preach at Mass. They also assist at a bless marriages, preside at funerals. During the liturgy, a deacon wears a stole which is draped over his left shoulder. (Look It Up - Janet L. Alampi)*

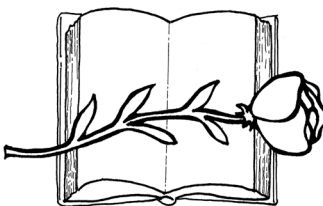
IMPORTANT REMINDER ABOUT PARKING
