Diocese of San Jose Layette Appeal Sponsored by YLI Maureen Institute #136 October 2015

During the month of October we will be collecting **newborn** baby clothes. Layettes are distributed by Santa Clara County Public Health Nurses to first time Mothers in need. Nearly 600 layettes are distributed every year. Other institutes of YLI, several other ladies groups and 30 parishes support this program. The diocese requests only **NEW clothes in the Newborn sizes 0-6 months** due to the low weight of the babies. 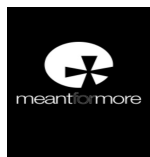

St. Joseph of Cupertino Social Justice Ministry

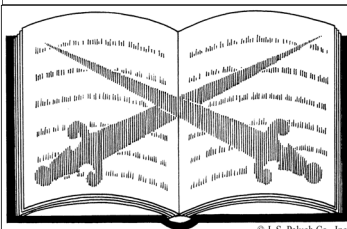
Mission Statement: The center of the Church's social teaching is the life, dignity and rights of every human person. Recognizing that the pursuit of social ministry is an essential part of what makes a parish Catholic, we commit ourselves to concrete works of charity, justice and peacemaking.

All major sporting events are occasions for a spike in human trafficking as women and young girls are moved into hotels in the areas around the sporting event. Pictures of these women are published on Craig's List and Backpage sites as sources of requesting their "services. Beyond prostitution this is exploitation of these women who are totally under the control of the trafficker. Google "Human Trafficking" to learn as much as you can about the signs of human trafficking and once aware, use the National Hotline 888-3737-888 to report a suspicious situation.

Fifty agencies in the Bay Area, including our San Jose diocesan-based Catholic Network to End Human Trafficking, are in collaboration to put together a sustainable system of resources to support victims.
