

Survey says . . .

The Parish Advisory Council (PAC) responds to your questions and comments from the parish survey last year.

Q27 Is there something else you would like to tell us about being a member of our parish?

Comment: Why does the wine need to be shared from one cup? I think a lot of people would chose to drink the wine if we used paper cups.

Since as Catholics we believe that we are partaking of the blood of the Lord Jesus and not just a representation of that blood, it must be treated with the utmost respect at all times. Individual containers used by other Christian denominations (who believe that communion is merely symbolic) are usually made of disposable plastic or paper and not suitable for use in Catholic churches. We use shared, rather than individual, cups for holy communion because our sharing symbolizes our oneness in Christ. Note that receiving the blood of Christ at mass is always optional, as we also believe that we receive the whole Christ, whether we are receiving his body or his blood.

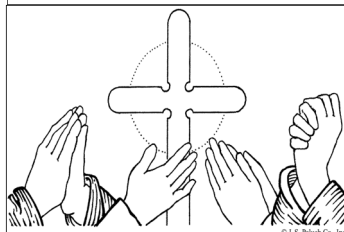
