COLLECTION FOR THE ARCHDIOCESE FOR THE MILITARY SERVICES: On the weekend of November 5-6, there will be a second collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services. This new second collection requested by the bishops of the United States supports the chaplains and staff providing pastoral care for the 1.8 million Catholics around the world currently serving in the military; enrolled in U.S. military academies; undergoing treatment at VA hospitals; working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders; and families of these persons. The Archdiocese for the Military Services receives no funding from the government or the military.
