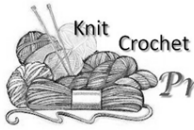




PENTECOST SUNDAY

CATHOLICISM 101- QUESTION FROM LAST WEEK :
What is the Sacrament of Confirmation? *ANSWER: Confirmation is one of the Sacraments of Initiation. It completes the grace of Baptism and consists of the laying on of hands, anointing on the forehead with chrism, and prayer. The words of Confirmation are ____ (name), be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit. In Confirmation the gifts of the Spirit are deepened and the person is strengthened in their faith to become more active members. (Look It Up! Janet L. Alampi)*

Rotating Shelter will be here at SJC in July!

This is the 25th year that St. Joseph of Cupertino has participated in the Faith in Action Silicon Valley Rotating Shelter program for homeless men in our area. We will be hosting the shelter once again from June 30th to July 29th in our parish, providing shelter, food, and assistance for up to 15 men who are willing and able to work and to regain their independence.

Faith in Action provides professional case management, overnight supervisors, and other supportive services for our clients, including assistance with job and housing searches. The applicants are carefully screened, are drug and alcohol free, and are allowed to stay for a period of up to 90 days, as long as they are in compliance with program requirements and are making progress towards the goal of self-sufficiency and permanent housing. Each month, the shelter "rotates" to a different church or synagogue.

The shelter will be located in our parish hall/school, and we will be asking for your assistance to provide dinners, do shopping for breakfast and lunch materials, and purchase items for hygiene and laundry kits. Quarters for laundry and monetary donations for this very worthy non-profit are greatly needed. We hope you will consider helping the shelter program in some capacity.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today, the languages of the whole world arise to God in a Pentecost of praise. In some American dioceses, the Mass is offered every Sunday in more than thirty different languages, including the silent praise of American Sign Language. Fifty years ago, the landscape of liturgy was very different. It was grounded firmly in Latin, which is to the present day still the official language of the Roman Rite. Very few people were fluent in Latin, even though in those days Latin was far more widely studied in school. Nevertheless, almost every Catholic was competent in the responses and chants of Latin since it is not difficult to pronounce. The clergy were normally minimally competent in Latin, since much of seminary education was conducted in that language.

When the Second Vatican Council was convened, all of the debate and daily work of the council was to be in Latin. In the first session in 1962, Boston's Cardinal Richard Cushing continually complained about it, and threatened not to return in 1963 if something wasn't done. He convinced the fathers when he rose to speak in fairly fluent Latin in an unforgettable Boston twang. The next year, he returned, but with a simultaneous translation system funded by the people of Boston. The ordinary everyday language of the people, the vernacular, had arrived at the Vatican via Boston!
